	1.	31/07/2019	<p>The facts would reveal, the child was admitted with Meningitis and was given Intravenous Polystyrene for 21 days. The complainant has come with a literature that would suggest, such medication should be given for maximum 12 days whereas the treating Paediatrician is of the view that the medical protocol would suggest 21 days medication. Since, the patient party was unable to pay the cost of medicines the nursing home used physician sample to complete the course. The baby was cured. He was discharged after 21 days as reported to us by the complainant.</p> <p>We do not find any scope to interfere save and except, observing, the hospital could have avoided use of physician sample without the consent of the patient party.</p> <p>The complaint is disposed of.</p>
