	2.	17/09/2019	<p>This complaint would relate to complication which has arisen during chemotherapy. The patient was suffering from stage four carcinoma in stomach. The treating doctor would contend, she was given palliative chemotherapy. This chemotherapy resulted in physical complication in the right hand of the patient for which the patient party had to spend a considerable amount. Even then, she was not cured, ultimately the patient died of cancer.</p> <p>The complainant would claim, they spent a sum of Rs.1.48 lakhs for the treatment of the patient at the clinical establishment which is a non Govt. voluntary organisation. Hence, they should be compensated at least, for the said amount.</p> <p>We are unable to accept her request. The said amount might have been spent for treatment of the patient that would include chemotherapy which is a costly process. In our view, a token compensation of Rs. 50,000/- be paid by the clinical establishment within a month from date. The complainant would submit a cancelled cheque to the clinical establishment within a week from date so that the clinical establishment could transfer the amount within a month thereafter.</p> <p>Sd/- Hon'ble Chairperson</p>
