

	1.	30/07/2019	<p>The patient came up for admission through emergency in a critical condition. He was shifted to ICU. He was discharged on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of admission under DAMA. The complainant would allege, the patient acquired hospital related infection immediately after admission. It is pertinent to note, the patient was admitted on February 25, 2018 and the Acentric Bacteria was found on the next day. Doctors present in the panel, are unanimous of the view, such bacteria could be acquired at least 3-4 days after hospitalization. The patient was under treatment in another hospital for three days. Hence, it is not clear whether the said bacteria related infection was acquired at the present establishment and not the other. Hence, giving the benefit of doubt , we do not find any scope to interfere with this complaint.</p>



The complaint is disposed of accordingly.


