The medical experts present in the panel are prima-facie satisfied with the explanation given by the treating doctor about the nature of the treatment given to the patient.</p> <p>The patient came for delivery. We are told, both the mother and the baby were discharged in good condition and they are well. The complainant, husband of the patient, was not present at the time of delivery. The Clinical Establishment has video recorded the statement of the father of the patient who came for delivery. We are satisfied about the treatment, hence, we do not find any scope to interfere with the matter.</p> <p>We, however, make it clear, in case the applicant wants to reopen the case he would be at liberty to apply for quashing of this order explaining his absence.</p> <p>The complaints are disposed of.</p>
